Guardian Impact

In 2021, 84% of our budget was invested in Park interpretation, preservation, and education. In-kind contributions of partners and volunteers equal approximately \$100,000 more in direct investment. Individual Guardians contributed 50% more in 2021 than 2020. Increasing individual and business giving is a priority in our capacity building campaign focused on creating sustainable support for Great Basin National Park. Partnerships and innovative solutions have ensured that Great Basin Guardians make a great impact even with a relatively small budget.







Great Basin Education

Great Basin National Park has many unique resources- hardy ecosystems with endemic species and the oldest trees on the planet, tangled underground caverns, a remote wild beauty and the darkest of skies. The Park has asked Great Basin National Park Foundation to take the lead in developing and implementing educational programs that connect young and old, both in the Park and throughout the Great Basin region, to this singular place.

In 2021, we supported three Scientist in the Park interns, one Reach for the Stars intern, and an artist-in-residence. Together, they helped the Park reach over 8,000 people through astronomy programs, cave tours, and elementary through high school programs. We updated the Junior Ranger booklet, supported the annual citizen science BioBlitz, and the annual Astronomy Festival. We also supported wayside exhibits in the Alpine Lakes Loops, Bristlecone Pine trail, and Mather Overlook, and secured a permanent backcountry repeater for the Park to ensure visitor safety.

Dark Skies and Wonder

Known for having the darkest, clearest, and most stable skies in the contiguous U.S., Great Basin National Park is a gateway to the cosmos. This is a precious marvel, as 80% of Americans cannot view the Milky Way from where they live due to light pollution. Great Basin National Park Foundation helps to connect thousands of youth and adults to Great Basin's spectacular dark skies each year through telescope viewing, research, education, and outreach.

Dark Skies, Bright Minds

The Great Basin Observatory, the only research-grade astronomical observatory located in a U.S. National Park – celebrated its 5th anniversary in the summer of 2021. To help celebrate, students who study double star systems, black holes, and cataclysmic variables came to the Park to share their research with the public (it was the first Park visit for all of them). Since the GBO is in the darkest of places but operated completely remotely, it allows students from universities and high schools in urban light-polluted regions of Nevada, Utah, and California to peer deep into the universe.

This year we created a short planetarium film about the GBO and Great Basin dark skies, including how and why to preserve them. We also created a semester-long online module for educators to work with high school students to conduct double star research and produce peer reviewed academic papers. We brought youth from the Ely Shoshone tribe to their first Great Basin National Park Astronomy Festival. And we facilitated another successful STARFEST research symposium.

We installed a new high-resolution spectrometer at the GBO which can be used to look for exo-planets and even extraterrestrial life, and we helped spot several large asteroids for NASA/SETI. For the third year in a row, the annual GBO scholarship was awarded to a talented female undergraduate (Ava Covington, University of Nevada, Reno). As it turns out, female students are the majority of GBO researchers.



Legacy Guardians

Long-time board member Michael Niggli announced this summer that he and his wife, Linda, are committing a \$250,000 legacy gift to Great Basin National Park Foundation. This planned gift is the first of its kind to support Great Basin National Park and the Great Basin Observatory.
